Elmer Sands Flood defences COMPLETED

As you are no doubt aware, the final phase of the Environment Agency (EA) beach defences has been completed. It was designed to remove the risk of flooding from the sea for much of the estate for the next 50 years. Walking along the top of the beach on a sunny evening it looked beautiful let's hope they got their sums right!

Also recently completed is West Sussex County Council's solution for surface water flooding. This project involved installing new larger diameter pipe work and gullies in the roads, new runs of drains for example at the Manor Way entrance, and a re-profiling of the Elmer ditch to re-establish the route for surface water to the sea.

Personally, after so many years of what felt like banging your head against a wall I am delighted. It has been a long time since Geoff Matcham, a resident of The Hard, started his campaigns with his first letters of complaint in 1984. Thank you to everyone who has been involved in achieving what at times has felt like the impossible.

Grass verge Protection in the Winter



Every Winter the grass verges are

softened by the wetter weather and they get churned up by vehicle activity which reduces the efficiency of the drainage and leaves a muddy mess. Please DO NOT park on the verges when they are soft. <u>Homeowners must repair any damage caused by their own</u> <u>activity</u>. Any other cases can be reported to ESL for repair.

BOLLARDS To protect the verges, Members are permitted to install bollards or posts of individual choice outside their own properties. It is mandatory that these bollards are visible in the dark e.g. white/fitted with reflectors and they must not cause an obstruction or hazard.



Please make Space for off Road Parking Residents should avoid filling up the front of their properties with items that prevent them from using their own land to park.

We appeal to all Residents to be considerate when parking and to comply with the published ESL Estate Parking Policy.

Comet Corner Improvements – Or Not! As some of you may be aware a petition was raised April 2018 to challenge West Sussex County Council to consider making road safety improvements to Comet Corner, which I'm sure you will agree continues to be a dangerous and difficult road junction to traverse. That created some attention - so thank you to all who signed. However, the junction has continued to prove hazardous.

Up until Covid struck, discussions and planning were running fairly smoothly with further schemes to improve the A259 from Flansham to Littlehampton. As plans currently stand, these schemes are going for Public Review and Strategic Planning Review which may hopefully be completed by year end or soon thereafter. However, it has now come to light that these improvements must go for a **Business Planning Review and** the date for submission is not until second quarter 2023 -

TWO AND A HALF YEARS AWAY! This review is then expected to take about nine months, after which a decision would be made as to whether the improvements would be approved or not.

This means we would not know until 2024 if the improvements will happen and potentially construction may or may not happen until 2025/2026.

Our concerns have been raised with Middleton Parish Council who, at the time of writing, seem to accept the WSCC schedule.

Myself and a number of other residents have now formed a Committee (Comet Corner Improvements Committee -CCIC) to start our own

campaign to lobby that improvements to Comet Corner are made sooner. Your comments and support on this matter would be very much appreciated as homeowners of Elmer Sands and if anyone would like to join us in our campaign by becoming a member of CCIC please contact me direct.
