Obviously this was temporary fix so we have been talking to the EA and a meeting is planned in the near future to discuss more permanent solution. LS





At the beginning of the month our Free Water Butts arrived and what a momentous task it was to get them all delivered in so short a time. A big thank you must go out to all those amazing volunteers who got the job done particularly ESL Director Peter Trebble who organised the logistics of it all.

Thanks to a grant won for Elmer Sands by Kim Edden, The Secretary and I from West Sussex County Council's Community Flood Prevention Fund the estate took delivery of 450 Water Butts. Once installed - see the water butt setup diagram on Page 3 – they should intercept a lot of water to reduce flooding during future heavy rainfall.

Please note: For optimum efficiency <u>completely</u> empty butts manually whenever a bad storm threatens. LS

Dog Fouling - A Community Issue

It has been highlighted by many residents that there is an increase in the problem of dog-fouling on the Estate. Dogs are being let off leads in the dark or wandering around without owners in the daytime resulting in fouling taking place un-witnessed on the grass verges. The beachfront and pathways are particular problem areas, especially of concern because of the serious health risks, particular to young children. The ESL grounds contractor has discovered large recently quantities of dog waste bags shoved down the drain gullies causing blockages and he has had to fish these out, not a

pleasant task and definitely not in his contract!

Residents who witness incidents of dog fouling should report to the Arun District Council Dog Warden tel: 01903 737679 or visit www.arun.gov.uk

Since ADC will only act on reports that include identification of the dog owners, we need to find other ways to deter dog fouling. ESL has put up some temporary signage on some verges around the Estate but if anyone has ideas to share please contact the Secretary.

Several years ago, former ESL Directors secured a number of dog bins throughout the Estate and free weekly emptying services. Dog Walkers could take their bags home or use normal waste bins (now approved by WSCC). There is no excuse for leaving dog waste in public places.

This is a community issue and all residents need to be vigilant and try to report any incidents witnessed.

FELPHAM ART GROUP

Elmer's Islands

Once upon a time Elmer was famous for its sands, hence the name Elmer Sands.

We had groynes then which broke down the cross currents, the design of them varied, one of them was locally called "the circus" due to its shape. They were lovely to lean against in the warm sunshine.

Gradually with changes in the height of the tides there was an increase in the risk of flooding, and sadly in 1984 the inhabitants of Manor Court were badly flooded and the same thing happened the following year. Cuttings from the local press are available showing rescue boats rowing along Manor Way.

At that time there were split responsibilities for our coastal sea defenses between the National River Authority (NRA) and Arun District Council (ADC). The NRA built the first two experimental rock islands followed by a further six, financed by ADC.

The rocks for the first islands came from the Mendips in Somerset, but latterly they came by ship from Norway. The ships were moored at mid-tide and the rocks were pushed into low water and then skillfully picked up at low tide and placed into position on the islands. The work had to continue day and night which meant there were loud noises intermittently for many weeks.

Then there was the shingle backup to be distributed at and around High Water: Ships came in capable of carrying tons of this material opened a part of their hull and discharged their cargo on the sea bed, closing up the hull and then floating off at the next high tide – usually.

On one occasion the captain misjudged the tides and the ship was grounded for a number of *Cont over*.

Cont. days until a high enough tide enabled it to float off again. During this period the ship became a local attraction and when the weather was good some people were seen picnicking there.

There is no doubt that the islands have served their purpose well and hopefully will protect the shore for a long time to come. Reg Came

Installation Information:

For your new free Storm Buffer Water butts to work properly it is essential that they are installed correctly. Please see diagram above. They will partially empty automatically but for optimum efficiency completely empty water butts manually whenever a bad storm threatens. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask.
