Dog Fouling - A Community Issue

It has been highlighted that there is an increased dogfouling problem on the Estate. with dogs being let off leads in the dark and fouling taking place un-witnessed on the grass verges. Other dogs are left to wander about alone barking and causing а nuisance in the daytime. The beachfront is also a problem area, especially due to the serious health risks to young children. Residents who witness incidents of doa fouling should report to the Arun District Council Dog Warden 01903 737679 Tel: or dog.wardens@arun.gov.uk

Since ADC will only act on reports that include identification of the doa owners, we need to find other ways to deter dog fouling. Several years ago, former ESL Directors secured a number of dog bins throughout the Estate and free weekly emptying services. However the Estate still suffers at the hands of those dog owners who couldn't care less, despite how their actions affect neighbours and families, their and thev continue to create an unpleasant environment for everyone else to suffer. This is a community issue and all residents need to be vigilant and try to report anv incidents witnessed.
