Q1 It has always been policy to keep the estate and its facilities for the sole benefit of the ESL members and guests, examples a) taking steps to reject any unauthorised parking on the estate; b) as the sign says on the Kiosk garden and field "Residents only"; c) users of the Boat Yard and the facilities being primarily for ESL members.
