Beach Sea Defence Project - The Environment Agency (EA) are finalising investigations with their consultants on the

four preferred options, reported on the ESL notice boards and ESL Website. ESL expects to have a meeting with the EA late March or early April to discuss their findings and this will enable more detail to be passed on at the ESL AGM.

Surface Water Management Plan (SWMP) - The latest proposals tabled by WSCC envisage an improvement to the ESL surface water drains primarily at four locations across the estate, Elmer Drive/ Acton Way; The Hard; Sea Way and Manor Way entrance. In addition the ditch running from Ancton Way through Elmer Close will be profiled to take surface water directly south to the sea outfall. WSCC are currently drawing down the funding from the Environment Agency to enable this work to be carried out and it is expected that WSCC will soon provide ESL with more detail of the proposed work.



Leonard (Len) Chappell 9th May 1940 – 12th February 2018

We are extremely sad to announce the passing of our dear friend and committee member Len Chappell, who was very suddenly taken ill during February and diagnosed with acute leukaemia from which he was unable to recover.

He readily volunteered to deliver the local newsletters for both the estate and parish council. A big man with a big personality loved by many and so sadly missed.

Len is remembered by his family as a very loving husband, father and grandfather and they would like to thank everyone for all the kind words received for him.

Damaged Verges

Everyone will have noticed that every year the grass verges are softened by the wet weather and become churned up under the tyres of vehicles. This reduces the efficiency of the drainage and looks very unsightly.

As the weather improves ESL will undertake to repair the common verges but we appeal to Members to kindly do their best to re-shape, re-seed and protect the areas close to their own homes and those which are affected by their own activity.

Trees Planted on Verges - Trees planted on the ESL verges are either owned by ESL or remain in the ownership of the member who has planted them. It is a criminal offence for anyone to damage or attack them and if this occurs the owner is at liberty to report this to the police for investigation and possible prosecution.

Elmer Sands Emergency Contingency Plan

After the exceptional rainfall and subsequent flooding of the Estate in June 2012, it seemed sensible to be prepared for any emergency that might occur in the future. It was clear that as well as being able to contact the emergency services we needed a hotline to Arun District Council to ensure that all the agencies knew what was happening in Elmer Sands from the onset. (Unfortunately in June 2012 as we were cut off completely and all help phone lines were busy, no one knew the situation for most of the first day). With this in mind, a small group of us decided to put in place a basic Elmer Sands Emergency Plan so that we would have that hotline. We are currently reviewing it again.

As an addition to the document we are compiling a list of volunteers. So if you would like to help especially if you have any assets or resources that would be helpful (e.g. 4x4 vehicles, tree surgeons, pumps, emergency training) please contact the Secretary. This information will be treated as confidential.

In the event of an emergency please phone Elmer Sands First Contacts. They will phone the emergency services on behalf of the Estate and then Arun District Council's Duty Emergency Co-ordinator on a restricted line advising them of the type and scale of the emergency.

The names of the First Contacts can be found at the end of Elmer Sands Emergency Contingency Plan which can be downloaded from our website. If you do not have a computer please contact the Secretary who can provide you with a printed copy.
